


BY CITIZENSHIP


BY AGE GROUP

- The largest segment (aged 45 and above) reflects the prevalence of chronic diseases in an ageing population.


BY PER CAPITA INCOME

- 91% of our beneficiaries belong to the lowest 20% of our community by Household Income (Dept of Statistics), Year 2018.


BY SUPPORT CATEGORY


- Funding support provided is crucial to our beneficiaries as their medical expenses exceed their Per Capita Income.



TRAINING OUR CANCER PROFESSIONALS PALLIATIVE CARE COURSE FOR THERAPISTS 2019

The Palliative Care Course for Therapists was a two-part training session that took place from 20 - 21 August and 3 September 2019.

The course, designed for therapists across all disciplines aimed to provide them with the knowledge and skills to work with critically ill patients and their family members.

The course covered a clinical overview of common life-limiting illnesses, serious illness communication, basic symptom management, role of therapists in managing patients with progressive life-limiting illness, and integration of these therapies into a 'holistic management' of patients.

Pre-readings conducted in the form of e-learning, and actual day lectures were both deployed as part of case studies. Role-playing further enhanced participants' understanding and confidence in servicing the needs of patients on palliative care.

Participant Ong Jie Xin felt that there is definitely a growing demand for allied health interventions for patients with palliative care needs. She shared that it was encouraging to witness the profession pushing to the forefront of problem-solving and improving the quality of care in this area.

"Personally, I found the communication component very useful, as it taught me practical skills to facilitate a meaningful conversation and goal setting during a therapy session."

REACHING OUT TO THE COMMUNITY

In March, April and October 2019, from 5pm to 6pm every Tuesday, Warna 94.2FM (Malay) radio station DJs (TG and RZ) interviewed NCIS doctors, social workers, patients affected by cancer and cancer survivor, Member of Parliament Dr Intan Azura Mokhtar.

The broad discussions covered a range of topics including awareness campaigns and specific cancer treatments. Results from a survey at a Malay community outreach initiative showed that up to 30% of the community tuned in to the show.
