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# NUHS ADVANCED INTERNAL MEDICINE SENIOR RESIDENCY PROGRAMME

The NUHS Advanced Internal Medicine Senior Residency Programme is a two-year comprehensive programme that aims to build on the experience and competencies gained during the basic internal medicine residency training.

Our vision is to train generalists of the future across a spectrum of care. We aim to equip graduates with knowledge, skills and attitudes to handle undifferentiated presentations and manage the interplay of conditions in patients with increasing multimorbidity.

The two-year programme consists of 18 months of training in general internal medicine and 6 months of elective rotations.

Elective rotations can include any of the following: cardiology, dermatology, endocrinology, gastroenterology, geriatric medicine, haematology, infectious diseases, medical oncology, MICU, neurology, palliative medicine, psychiatry, rehabilitation medicine, renal medicine, respiratory medicine or rheumatology.

## Programme Structure

The two-year NUHS Advanced Internal Medicine Senior Residency Programme consists of 18 months of General Medicine (GM) core rotations in National University Hospital, Ng Teng Fong General Hospital, Alexandra Hospital, NUHS@Home and a Cross-Cluster Rotation. The remaining six months are spent in elective rotations.
