

**Bilateral Exchange Program  
JSPS-NUS Joint Research Project and  
Joint Seminar Application Guideline for  
FY2027**

**1. Purpose**

The Japan society for the Promotion of Science (JSPS) and the National University of Singapore (NUS) carries out bilateral cooperative in accordance with their mutual agreement on international scientific collaboration. The aim of this programme is to form sustained networks evolved from individual scientist exchanges including young scientists, in the areas of Natural Sciences, Humanities and Social Sciences.

**3. Requirements**

Projects must meet the following criteria:

<b>Japanese participants</b>	Japanese participants must hold a full-time or equivalent position as a researcher at a University or research institute in Japan that is eligible to receive Grants-in-Aid for Scientific Research – KAKENHI.	
<b>Singaporean principal researcher</b>	Singaporean principal researcher must be an <b>academic staff under tenure track appointment</b> employed at universities or other research institutions managed or designated by NUS.	
<b>Composition of participants</b>	Research Projects should be jointly conducted by Japanese and Singaporean teams. Researchers who belong to institution/organization in third countries are not allowed to participate.	Seminars should be international ones attended by researchers of both countries to discuss a specific research topic. Researchers from third countries may also participate at their own expense.
<b>Duration</b>	Up to 2 years	Up to 1 week
<b>Commencement and Implementation Periods</b>	Researchers must start their research from 1 April 2027.	Seminars should be held between 1 April 2027 to 31 March 2028.
<b>Total amount of support provided</b>	<p>Up to S\$38,000 per project, per fiscal year<sup>1</sup></p> <p>JSPS and NUS will cover the costs of its own country's participants.</p>	<p>Up to S\$38,000</p> <p>JSPS and NUS will cover the costs of its own country's participants. Costs associated with holding seminars will be covered by the host country.</p>
<b>Other requirements</b>	In principle, trips to third countries are not allowed. (Field trips or international conference presentations are exceptions.)	Seminar should be held in either Japan or Singapore.

<sup>1</sup> Stated amount is for Singapore researcher. The researcher's counterpart in Japan would be provided with an equal amount of funding.

#### **4. Types of support provided by NUS/NTU**

(The following allowances will be provided to the Joint Research Projects/Joint Seminars principal investigator's affiliated institution.)

##### **A. Joint Research Projects**

###### Allowances for Singapore researchers<sup>2</sup>

1. International travel costs: A round-trip air ticket to and from the designated research location (includes VISA application, travel insurance, etc), daily allowances, accommodation, and domestic travel expenses in Japan and Singapore.
2. Research expenses: Costs of expendable supplies, printing fees, communication expenses, conference expenses, honorarium, and miscellaneous expenses, etc.

##### **B. Joint Seminars held in Singapore**

###### Allowances for Singapore researchers<sup>2</sup>

1. Costs associated with holding a joint seminar (include preparatory meeting and post-meeting reviews): Conference expenses, costs of expendable supplies, printing fees, communication expenses, honorarium, and miscellaneous expenses, etc.
2. Domestic travel expenses for conducting Joint Seminars

##### **C. Joint Seminars held in Japan**

###### Allowances for Singapore researchers<sup>2</sup>

1. International travel costs: A round-trip air ticket to and from the seminar venue, daily allowances, accommodation, and domestic travel expenses in Japan and Singapore.
2. Costs associated with holding a joint seminar (include preparatory meeting and post-meeting reviews): Conference expenses, costs of expendable supplies, printing fees, communication expenses, honorarium, and miscellaneous expenses, etc.

## 5. Application

Applications should be submitted through iRIMS-Sponsored Projects system to Faculty, and reach Office of the Deputy President (Research and Technology) by **3 September 2026**.

Please check with respective Faculties on internal deadlines for submission.

**Applications must be submitted concurrently to JSPS and NUS** by Principal Investigators (PI) in their respective countries. **Applications to only a single organization will not be considered.**

## 6. Selection results

NUS will notify the NTU office of research and relevant NUS Faculties/Schools of the selection results, estimated to be by February 2027.

## 7. Post-selection (for NUS academic staff only<sup>3</sup>)

Upon notification of selection, PIs are required to obtain research compliance and submit the relevant documents to ODPRT for account creation (only if applicable) as follow:

### Account Creation:

- (i) Budget phasing form

### Research Compliance:

- (i) Schedule 1 form for development of Research Collaboration Agreement (RCA) by ILO (if necessary).
- (ii) Cover/Endorsement page
- (iv) Risk assessment declaration form(s)
  - For non lab-based projects or lab-based projects
  - **IRB** (human subject clearance)
  - **IACUC** (animal use and care clearance)
- (v) For research held in other countries. E.g.
  - Malaysia
  - Thailand

**Co-Funding:**

A new WBS account will be opened for the selected project, and funds will be transferred on a yearly basis to the account. The project will be co-funded by ODPRT and Faculty/Department in the proportion of 50% to 50%. PIs may seek assistance from the respective faculty or department to inform ODPRT of the WBS number providing 50% of funding support. This is required before ODPRT processes funds transfer to the WBS account of the new project.

**Research collaboration agreement:**

A research collaboration agreement (RCA) should be applied for through the Industry Liaison Office (ILO) if there is a likelihood of inventing, creating or developing new Intellectual Property in the research project. **8. Administrative duties of Joint Research Projects or Joint Seminars Principal Researchers and their affiliated institutions**

- (1) Principal researchers of Joint Research Projects or Joint Seminars must submit a report through his/her university or institution using the prescribed format.
- (2) Due acknowledgement of support by JSPS and NUS/NTU should be made in any publication resulting from the joint projects/seminars.

**9. Notes**

- (1) Research projects related to military affairs will not be considered/supported.
- (2) NUS/JSPS shall not be responsible for any sickness or accidents during the implementation period for Joint Research Projects.
- (3) The names of the awardees, research meetings, and research themes as well as the names of principal researchers of Joint Research Projects and Joint Seminars in partner countries and reports are subject to public disclosure.
